Creator Sketch

Cynthia W. Shelmerdine (1949-present) was raised in Cambridge, Massachusetts and developed a passion for the Greek language early in life. She was introduced to Emily and Cornelius Vermeule in her youth and regarded them both as neighbors and mentors. After high school, Shelmerdine followed her passion of Greek to Bryn Mawr College, where she earned a bachelor's degree in Greek. Shortly after, Shelmerdine attended Cambridge University as a Marshall Scholar, where she earned a second bachelor's degree (1972) and a master's degree (1980) in Classics. During her graduate pursuits, Shelmerdine began to combine her love of Greek with an interest in archaeology and participated in the University of Minnesota Messenia Expeditions during the summers of 1972– 1975. During this time, Shelmerdine focused on Late Helladic pottery at Nichoria and developed a passion for Linear B. With her work and experiences at Nichoria, Shelmerdine developed dissertation material and earned a Ph.D. in Classical Philology from Harvard University in 1977 under the direction of Emily Vermeule.

In 2002, Shelmerdine began teaching at the University of Texas at Austin. Her course material focused on several aspects of ancient Greece, with particular emphasis on language and archaeology. During her time at the University of Texas, Shelmerdine served as department chair twice, and became a Robert M. Armstrong Centennial Professor of Classics and gained emerita status by the time of her retirement from the university in 2008. Shelmerdine went on to teach abroad at Oxford and Cambridge.

Throughout the course of her professional career, Shelmerdine served as a Research Associate at both Bowdoin College and Harvard University. She served as faculty at University of Texas at Austin, Oxford University, and Cambridge University as a Bye-Fellow, and served as Visiting Professor at Bristol University, Whitman College, Dartmouth College, the University of Minnesota, and the American School for Classical Studies at Athens. Additionally, Shelmerdine has lectured at both Stanford University, the University of Washington, and numerous societal lectures. In addition to her time serving as faculty and lecturer, Shelmerdine has served as chair for departments, committees, workshops, symposia, colloquia, and both undergraduate and graduate student review boards.

Shelmerdine's diverse research includes Mycenaean pottery, politics and economics, literacy, and society where she focuses on women's roles and the perfume industry. She has written numerous books and chapters or chapter contributions, as well as articles and encyclopedic entries. Additionally, Shelmerdine has delivered numerous presentations and lectures and has authored many book and film reviews.

Scope and Content

The Cynthia Shelmerdine collection includes publications and manuscripts, public lectures and colloquium papers, research, course material, offprints, correspondence, and ephemera. The collection material predates her time in the Classics Department at the University of Texas (1966) and extends to the time she left the University in 2008. The collection is separated into fifteen

boxes, with the Offprints series being the largest series (six boxes). These series remain in the original arrangement and scope as stored by Cynthia Shelmerdine for her professional records.

The first group of the collection consists of Shelmerdine's Academic Publications series (Boxes 1–3). This group includes academic publications like articles, chapters, and commentary pieces. These sub-groups are arranged by year in the chronology of their publication, then arranged alphabetically by work title. Publication series at the item-level can include finished offprints, manuscripts, notes or research materials, proof copies, correspondence related to the publication (like with the publisher), and miscellaneous records related to its completion, like receipts.

The Publicly Delivered Works series (Boxes 4–5) contains the publicly delivered lectures, seminars, workshops, and similar materials by Shelmerdine where she was invited as a speaker at conferences, international congresses, colloquia, annual meetings, or specific events. The series also includes materials from conferences which Shelmerdine attended but did not deliver a public work (for example, if she chaired a panel at an annual AIA meeting). There will be overlap with the Academic Publications series, where publications derive from an earlier state as a paper at a conference, international congress, or public lecture. These are indicated in the finding aide with a reference to "SEE" a different folder. Each folder in this series is dedicated to a specific work and sometimes the paper itself is missing with only a reference to the paper in the event's program. Records pertaining to works or events include lecture manuscripts, handwritten notes on papers, conference documents like programs and handouts, travel documents like itineraries or receipts, and items of correspondence relating to the conference. These records are arranged by year, then alphabetically by work title.

The Book and Film Review series (Box 6) contains reviews Shelmerdine has published between the years preserved in this collection. These can include manuscripts of the review and offprints of the published article. These records are arranged by year of publication.

The Offprints series (Boxes 7–12) is the largest series in the Shelmerdine collection and includes offprints from various conferences, international congresses, colloquiums, annual meetings, or specific events. This series is broken into two sub-groups: Offprints A–Z and Homer. The Offprints A–Z series (Boxes 7–11) includes offprints from Shelmerdine's colleagues at the University of Texas. This series is arranged alphabetically by author (last name, first name). The Homer series (Box 12) contains offprints pertaining to Homer from various authors. This series was arranged alphabetically by work title, which reflects the original arrangement as stored by Shelmerdine for her personal records.

The Consulting/ Peer Review series (Box 13) contains correspondence and draft notes regarding her comments and advice regarding various publications pertaining to classical subjects. These include publications from the National Geographic Magazine and Cambridge University. This series is arranged by chronology, then alphabetically by work title.

The Teaching/ Course Material series (Box 14) and the Research Material series (Box 15) are both small series. The Teaching/ Course material series is limited to a single semester taught abroad in 1987 and includes her lecture notes and the lecture notes of Thomas G. Palaima and John F. Cherry. The Research Material series contains various materials dating from 1966 to 1994 and includes

research notes on perfumed oils, Pylos tablets, palimpsests, and various workshops. These materials include manuscripts, handwritten notes, photographs and the associated original mail packaging, draft report figures, a workshop notebook, and associated correspondence. The series is arranged by chronology, then alphabetically by topic.

Additionally, the Research Material series (Box 15) includes her Correspondence series (1 folder, Box 15) and her Ephemera series (1 folder, Box 15). The Correspondence series is limited to a single email to Shelmerdine from an unknown correspondent with no known date. The final series in this collection is the Ephemera series (1 folder, Box 15). This series includes numerous newspaper clippings dating from 2004 to 2007 and range from articles regarding various classical topics to cartoons relating to classics, and obituaries. This folder was not organized in any particular manner but left in the original arrangement as stored by Shelmerdine.

The materials were donated by Cynthia W. Shelmerdine to PASP under the custody of Thomas G. Palaima. The collection was transferred to the Department of Classics at the University of Cincinnati in 2024.
