



To the Editor:- Dr. V. Karageorghis has recently lectured here on the archaic tombs of Salamis in Cyprus. In the dromoi of several of these tombs had been slaughtered, still harnessed to chariots. There is thus some new material for the study of ancient chariots, and despite the difference in date it is likely that in details as well as in the custom Cyprus was continuing a Mycenaean tradition. One point seems immediately relevant to the descriptions of harness on the Knossos tablets; he has identified sets of blinkers, some of ivory and some of bronze, one actually having a representation of an eye on it. It would seem that some of the objects which have been regarded as "face-pieces" are really blinkers, and this leads me to propose this meaning for o-po-qo.

COMMUNICATIONS

With the generous cooperation of the Director of the National Museum in Athens, ELB and JC were able to spend the better part of two days in July, 1965, in the examination of several doubtful readings among the tablets from Pylos. The following is a selection from the resulting readings, chiefly those which seem to differ in substance from the texts of the original publications. Unless otherwise indicated these readings are agreed upon by ELB and JC after joint examination and discussion.

PY Vn 46: sup. mut. (At least one rule is visible above line 1, and at least one line of text is probable. ELB) line 1: pi-ra₃[line 2: a-ti-ja , 6 [line 3: 4 line 4: 12[line 5: 81 ; o-pi-ṭe-te-re or o-pi-ṛa₃-te-re Neither inspires confidence ; 40 line 6: 23 line 7: pi-ri-ja-o line 9: e-[.]wo-ke line 12: e-ṛu-[mi]-ni-ja

PY Vn 48.6:]wo-no-wa-[.]si JC;]wo-no-wa-ṭi-si ELB In either case the possible readings are ti or pi, and the choice difficult.

PY On 300.8: o-de-qa-a₂ The mark sometimes taken as a word-divider after de is oblique from left to right and runs from a broken edge. This is possibly all one word without word-divider. The mark of word-division is certainly present in only one place in this text, and certainly absent in several places where division is to be understood.

PY Ma 397.1: a-[.]ta₂ (i. e. a-[.]-*66) The missing sign is almost certainly not *85; perhaps an otherwise unrecorded sign.

PY Un 443: whole tablet possibly written and erased before inscription of the present text line 3: HORD 2 te-ri-ja This reading is probable; mu-te-ri-ja is apparently to be rejected. 2 is written as one stroke above the other; the lower was not erased, and cuts the rule. (It seems possible that an original text,]do-ke , ka-pa-ti-ja , [*145 6], preceded the present text. ELB)

PY Ab 554 and Ab 582: These two pieces are unlikely to belong to the same tablet, though it is just possible. The present height of 582 is definitely a little greater.

JC offers this further comment. If o-pi-ṛa₃-te-re is the correct reading in Vn 48.5, this can be interpreted opi(r)raisteres "hammers," cf. ῥαίστήρ. (Hom. θυμο-ραϊστής may well be a false archaism for θυμορραϊστής.

COMMUNICATIONS

The first International Congress of Mycenaeanology will be held in Rome under the auspices of the National Council of Research in September 1967.

The Congress will be organized in three sections: 1) Archaeological, 2) Philological, 3) Historical. For each of these sections are foreseen basic reports given by chosen specialists, and information on particular themes.

Further information may be had from the Centre of Mycenaean and Aegeo-Anatolian Studies, University of Rome, Italy.



Evangelia Protonotariou-Deilaki has suggested that the "Lion Gate" is in fact rather to be seen as a "Gryphon-Gate" with two winged Gryphons so that the scheme most closely resembled this seal. (M. Paraskevaidis in Kathimerini, 5 June 1966.)

An expedition from the Woods Hole Oceanographic Institute under the direction of James W. Mayor is reported by the Associated Press to be preparing to search this fall under the waters off Santorini for cities belonging to Atlantis, "the flourishing pre-historic city inundated within minutes by one of the great natural catastrophes of history."




CORRESPONDENCE

To the Editor:- Sur la translittération des "doublets" supposés de l'écriture Linéaire A.

Trois cas sont à distinguer:

a) L'écriture A comporte des couples de signes (L2 et L1; L53 et L58; L64 et L34) dont les deux constituants ont des formes très dissemblables, et que la seule référence à l'écriture B invite à considérer comme des doublets (L2 = pa et L1 = pa₃ par référence aux valeurs des signes B 3 et 56; L53 = ra et L58 = ra₂ par référence aux valeurs des signes B 60 et 76; L64 = pu et L34 = pu₂ par référence aux valeurs des signes B 50 et 29).

b) Valables ou non, des considérations combinatoires amènent à imaginer que deux signes A, de formes très dissemblables, ont, dans les inscriptions A, des valeurs identiques ou très voisines; ainsi Georgiev pour L81 et L82 qu'il translittère je et je₂; etc.

c) On peut être enfin tenté d'assimiler l'un à l'autre, du point de vue de leur valeur, deux tracés A, distingués dans les répertoires "officiels", mais se ressemblant plus ou moins entre eux, et qui, dans cette hypothèse, ne seraient que des variantes (non significatives) l'un de l'autre; ainsi, pour Georgiev, L90 = pe et L88 = pe₂; etc.

L'usage d'une même notation (exposants-chiffres) dans tous ces cas risque d'entraîner des confusions fâcheuses. Par exemple, Georgiev estime que le signe L99, quand il n'est pas idéogramme (VIR) a une valeur syllabique qu'il note a₂; or (que cette hypothèse soit vraie ou fausse) L99 n'a, en tout cas, rien de commun avec le signe 25 (a₂) du linéaire B.

Ne pourrait-on se mettre d'accord pour réserver la notation par exposants-chiffres aux cas du type a ci-dessus (pu₂, ra₂, etc.), et utiliser une notation accentuelle pour les cas des types b et c ci-dessus (jé, pé, etc.)? Peut-être ce problème pratique pourrait-il être soumis à un prochain colloque (ou congrès) de spécialistes?

To Professor Lejeune:- Though your suggestions are sensible, I would give different advice. On the negative side, I see neither reason nor profit in asking those who have deciphered Linear A as Chaldee, Chinese, and Chinook to follow a uniform system of transliteration. On the positive side, I would urge that references to Linear A signs should be primarily those of Pugliese Carratelli (the L-numbers), supplemented and modified where this is necessary (as by Pugliese Carratelli himself in his suggestion that L38 may be a variant of L77 and L100, or by Brice in adding L'1, or by another if he might suppose that L'37 is an official, or sacral, or elegantly calligraphic variant of L82). As for a conventional transcription of Linear A signs in the manner of Linear B, I would urge that such transcriptions be chosen as may best represent their hypothetical values, rather than the sources from which those values were derived. If, among the signs which can be thus transcribed there remain any pairs whose values in the present state of the science cannot be distinguished except by some variety of exponent, numerical or accentual, I believe there will be less confusion if the exponents belong to only one system. I. e., they should be either entirely accentual or entirely numerical. Unless, that is, one could say that the relationship of the values of a Linear A qa and qa₂ was of a different order from the relationship of the values of a Linear A kwa and kwá. In any event, no work using a conventional transcription should be without its own full concordance of L-numbers and the transcription used.

I would add only that one minor danger of importing Linear B transcriptions into Linear A is illustrated in your use of the value *pa₃ for Linear B 56, not infrequently printed, of course, but nevertheless not formally agreed upon as its conventional transcription.



This year's further excavations at Arkhanes for a palace, and at Phourni for a tholos tomb have been carried out with good results under the direction of John and Effie Sakellarakis with funds from the Greek Archaeological Society.



CORRESPONDENCE

To the Editor:-Three clay tablets with incised signs, from a Neolithic context in Rumania, seem likely to become the next cause célèbre in prehistoric archaeology. Their discovery was announced by N. Vlassa (Dacia 7 [1963] 485f.), the excavator of the site of Tărtăria. He reports that they were found in a level of the Tordoș phase of the Vinča culture.

The exceptional importance of the tablets was at once realised by V. Miložčić. He obtained the opinion of the late A. Falkenstein (Germania 43 [1965]) that the Tărtăria tablets are related to tablets of Protoliterate Sumeria, such as those of Warka IV, and not an independent product. The evidence for a direct Mesopotamian and Aegean connection has been summarised by V. Popovitch (Revue archéologique 1965:2, lf.).

The authenticity of the tablets appears established by their discovery during properly conducted excavations, and is supported by the appearance of similar signs on objects and pottery of the Vinča and Körös cultures (Popovitch op. cit. 35; V. G. Childe, The Danube in Prehistory [1929], 33; J. Todorovič and A. Cermanovič, Banitsa [1961], 42).

Many scholars would consequently date the Tărtăria tablets to around 3,000 B.C. or a little later. This is broadly in conformity with the chronological views of such authorities on the Vinča culture as Miložčić, D. and M. Garašanin and V. Dumitrescu. Already this is a remarkable situation: writing in Rumania earlier than the sealings from the Early Helladic II town of Lerna III, and earlier than the first pottery marks at Phylakopi I, which have often been cited as the first evidence of Aegean writing.



But this dating of the Vinča culture is that of the traditional school of European pre-historians. It is in direct contradiction with the results of radiocarbon dating. All scholars (both pro- and anti- C-14) agree that Vinča-Tordoš is considerably earlier than the Rumanian Gumelnitsa culture. The Gumelnitsa culture, on a C-14 chronology, clearly began early in the IVth millennium (G. Kohl and H. Quitta, Radiocarbon 8 [1966] 27; cf. J. Mellaart, Antiquity 24 [1960] 270 f.). No adjustment of half-lives or of atmospheric C-14 levels will make a radiocarbon dating for Vinča-Tordoš in the Vth millennium B. C. equivalent to a calendar date of c. 3,000 B. C. Indeed such adjustments as have to be made will probably work the other way (P. E. Damon, A. Long, D. C. Grey, Journal of Geophysical Research 71 [1966] 1055 f.). There are very feasible archaeological arguments to support the longer radiocarbon chronology and it seems possible that it will one day supersede the more roundabout culture parallel approach, despite the considerable attraction of the Tărtăria-Warka equation.

If the signs on the tablets and elsewhere indeed constitute writing we shall have to face the possibility that on a C-14 chronology, writing emerged or at least began to emerge, perhaps independently, in Europe late in the Vth millennium B. C. The alternative appears to be to reject radiocarbon completely as worthless, and to accept the presence, or at least influence, of Mesopotamian settlers in Rumania at the beginning of the IIIrd millennium. Either conclusion will be of interest for Greek European pre-history. But the first step must surely be for competent scholars to achieve a consensus that the signs are indeed to be regarded as writing. Is this certain?
