News

A bulldozer widening the road leading past the houses excavated by Wace up to the Lion Gate at Mycenae uncovered more houses on the other side of the road. The excavation of these has been begun by Mr. Verdelis, and will be continued with the help of Prof. Marinatos. Three houses have appeared, of the same period as those already excavated. In them are found fragments of fresco, pottery, including stirrup jars (LH III B), and some further Mycenaean (Linear B) inscriptions. From the southern-most of the three houses, in the SE corner there are two complete tablets, and about 15 fragments. Among the words already read and reported there seem to be two names already known from the tablets of the House of the Oil Merchant (Aul02). (Clipping from the Kathemerini, 8 February 1958 and by the kindness of several correspondants)
