Divorce contract (*synchoresis*) April 14, 13 BC

(a) *Addressee* |² To Protarchos,

(b1) Party 1

 $|^{3}$ from Zois the daughter of Herakleides, with $|^{4}$ as guardian her brother Eirenaios, the son of Herakleides,

(b2) *Party 2* [⁵ and from Antipatros, the son of Zenon.

(c) Joint agreement about the fact of divorce

 $|^{6}$ Zois and Antipatros agree that they have separated $|^{7}$ from one another, from their joint life established $|^{8}$ in accordance with an agreement through the same $|^{9}$ tribunal in the 17th year of Caesar (*Augustus*) $|^{10}$ in Hathyr,

(d) Agreement about the receipt of the dowry by the wife

and Zois agrees that she has received from $|^{11}$ Antipatros in cash and not through a bank what he himself held as a dowry: $|^{12}$ clothes worth $|^{13}$ 120 silver drachmas and a pair of gold earrings,

(e) Joint agreement about duties after the divorce

 $|^{14-15}$ and they agree that the marriage contract is ineffective right away and that $|^{16-17}$ neither Zois nor anyone else on her behalf will proceed against Antipatros $|^{18}$ concerning the demand for the return of the dowry $|^{19}$ and both agree that they will not proceed against one another concerning $|^{20}$ their joint life or concerning anything else $|^{21}$ whatsoever up to the present $|^{22}$ day, from which (*day*) they agree that it is permitted $|^{23}$ to Zois to marry another man $|^{24}$ and to Antipatros to marry another woman, $|^{25}$ while neither of them is accountable (*for it*).,

(f) Penalty clause

 $|^{26}$ and, apart from the fact that the things agreed upon are effective, $|^{27}$ they agree that the transgressor is also liable $|^{28}$ to the damages $|^{29}$ and the statutory penalty (*to the state*).
