Lease contract for a house (*synchoresis*) April 1, 11, or 21, 13 BC

(a) *Addressee* |² To Protarchos,

(b1) Party 1

|³ from Antonia Philemation, a freedwoman of (*Mark*) Antony, with as guardian |⁴ Gaius Iulius Felix,

(b2) *Party 2* and from Sarapion, the son of Aristeios, a Persian of the *epigone*.

(c) *Considerans*

Concerning the points at issue, $|{}^5$ we agree on the following terms such that, since Sarapion has leased from $|{}^6$ Antonia Philemation for a period of two years from Pharmouthi of the present 17th year of Caesar (*Augustus*) $|{}^7$ the house belonging to her in the Delta (*quarter*), along with the $|{}^8$ workshops on the street that come with it, for a fixed rent each month of 60 Ptolemaic silver drachmas, $|{}^9$ which (*rent*) he will duly pay each (*month*) in full to Antonia Philemation, $|{}^{10}$ free from any deduction or expense ... $|{}^{11}$... of each passing month at the latest on the 29th of the next month, while the repairs $|{}^{12}$ of the public ... and the sealings for the thatching and $|{}^{13}$ the inlet, interruption, and outlet of the public water-conduits are all $|{}^{14}$ the responsibility of Antonia Philemation, but the filth inside is the responsibility of $|{}^{15}$ Sarapion, who now that he has received the house furnished with doors and windows $|{}^{16}$ and locked (*with bolts*) and cleared of filth,

(d) Agreement of the lessee about the lease

agrees to uphold the $|^{17}$ lease for the time agreed upon, and to take any profit that he makes as his own, $|^{18}$ while he is permitted to let whoever he wants dwell in it or move out of it $|^{19}$ and to lease the house to others with the $|^{20}$ workshops on the street, while it is not permitted to him to abandon the lease within $|^{21}$ the time nor to drag his feet (*in paying*) the monthly rent payment, and, when the time $|^{22}$ has passed, he agrees that he will hand over the house with the $|^{23}$ doors and windows and bolts that are in them and also the $|^{24}$ (*other things*) that are in the house: a millstone and a wooden pulley and a $|^{25}$ wooden swing-beam attached to the wall and two toilet seats in ..., everything $|^{26}$ in the same condition as he received it, except for wear and tear,

(d) Penalty clause

and if Sarapion transgresses any of these (*provisions*), $|^{27}$ he agrees that he is immediately liable to seizure and can be held under arrest until he pays $|^{28}$ whatever he owes of the rent along with half as much again and the damages and expenses and the value of whatever he does not hand over and a penalty of 100 drachmas, $|^{29}$ and the statutory penalty (*to the state*), while the right of execution (*of the claim*) belongs to Antonia Philemation from Sarapion and from $|^{30}$ all his belongings just as if by virtue of a legal decision, while all safe-conducts (*and*) every kind of protection he adduces are ineffective, $|^{31}$ while Antonia Philemation has no less the right $|^{32}$ to evict Sarapion from the lease within the time, if he breaks the contract, and to let (*the house*) to others $|^{33}$ and to exact payment for the difference that will result because of re-letting,

(e) Agreement of the lessor about the lease

and if he does $|^{34}$ each of these things accordingly, Antonia Philemation agrees that she guarantees the lease to him $|^{35}$ for the time (*agreed upon*), $|^{36}$ or else she too pays the same penalty, and Sarapion will deduct for himself $|^{37}$ from the ... of the rent of 60 drachmas on account of ..., $|^{38}$ 8 drachmas, and if Sarapion duly pays $|^{39}$ the monthly rent to Antonia Philemation, he will receive $|^{40}$ from her slave Philargyros the $|^{41}$... receipt, and Antonia Philemation agrees $|^{42}$ that she has no reservations against ...
