Loan contract (*synchoresis*) April 12, 13 BC

(a) *Addressee* |²⁶ To Protarchos,

(b1) *Party 1* |²⁷ from Gaius Iulius Philios,

(b2) Party 2

and from Agathokles, the son of Sarasinos (?), and from Lykarion, $|^{28}$ the son of Apollonios, both Persians of the *epigone*.

(c) Agreement proper

Concerning the points at issue, Agathokles $|^{29}$ and Lykarion agree that they have received from Gaius Iulius Philios through the money-changing bank of Kastor an interest-free loan (BL 5.15) $|^{30}$ of 70 Ptolemaic silver drachmas, which they also agree to pay back within three $|^{31}$ months starting from the 1st of Pachon of the present 17th year of Caesar (*Augustus*), by giving each day $|^{32}$ the five obols due (*each day*) until the aforesaid balance is paid $|^{33}$ without skipping a single payment, and they agree to do this without (*the need for*) a trial $|^{34}$ or any dispute,

(d) Penalty clause

and if not, they agree that they are liable to seizure and can be held under arrest on whichever day $|^{35}$ they skip, without waiting for the time apportioned $|^{36}$ to them, until they pay the entire sum or whatever will be owed (*at that time*) along with half as much again $|^{37}$ and for the time that has passed (*the deadline*) the interest of two drachmas (*per 100 drachmas per month*) in accordance with the statute, while the right of execution (*of the claim*) belongs $|^{38}$ to Gaius Iulius Philios from the two debtors, who are each other's guarantors for payment, and from one and from whomever he chooses $|^{39}$ and from all their belongings just as if by virtue of a legal decision, and also from the two wood-selling workshops belonging to one of them, $|^{40}$ Agathokles, in the $|^{41}$ Delta (*quarter*), one in the area called Kamptra near the Kibotos, and the other in the $|^{42}$ area called Kepikon Balaneion, and they also agree until they pay $|^{43}$ to make sure that the (*wood-selling workshops*) remain unalienated and unencumbered by debt, and if a risk arises $|^{44}$ concerning them ..., even so this loan is free $|^{45}$ from any risk, while all safeguards (*and*) every kind of protection they adduce are ineffective,
